


Safari in Pafuri

to the news. The excitement shows on his face. Our evening drive to search for **game** is no longer a relaxing look at colourful birds like the lilac-breasted **roller**. With the news that lions have been sighted in the immediate area, it has become a **Big Five** **tracker's** dream.



A CLOSER LOOK

The **Big Five** is a name that hunters in the 19th century gave to the animals they found to be the most difficult and dangerous to kill: the lion, the leopard, the **Cape buffalo**, the elephant and the rhino.
