What do you do?

I work for a company that produces packaging materials. It's a family business with about 100 employees, from unskilled factory workers to top positions in management. I have worked my way up from a part-time job in the warehouse to head of marketing.

Our company has been named **employer of the year** twice. It offers a **generous benefits package**, with up to six weeks' **paid annual leave** and a **retirement plan**. Other **perks** include a **subsidized canteen** and **in-company childcare**. Sixty per cent of our **staff** are women.

We have a system of **flexitime**. Employees **clock in and out** using a chip card. Most of our **administrative staff** have regular **nine-to-five jobs**, while some of the **blue-collar jobs** involve **shift work**. Only one or two people **work from home**. As this is a rural area, many people **commute** long distances, so we've introduced a **carpool** system.

I spend most of my **working day** sitting at my desk, but I always try to make time for a **coffee break** to chat to my **colleagues**.
